- It would be very helpful if you make sure that your child is able to handle a knife and fork correctly, although staff are always willing to help when necessary



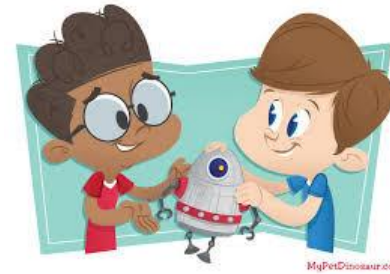
Make sure your child can use the toilet by themselves.



Sing rhymes and songs with your child.



Read to your child to help develop a love of books.



Encourage your child to share and take turns.



Help your child to use a knife, fork and spoon.



Encourage your child to try new foods.

Ways to help your child before starting school



Make sure your child can wash and dry their own hands.



Show your child how to open and close their lunch box and how to open wrappers and packaging on different foods.



Show your child how to take their shoes on and off. Velcro shoes are best.



Help your child to practise putting on and taking off their own coat.



Show your child how to use scissors safely.

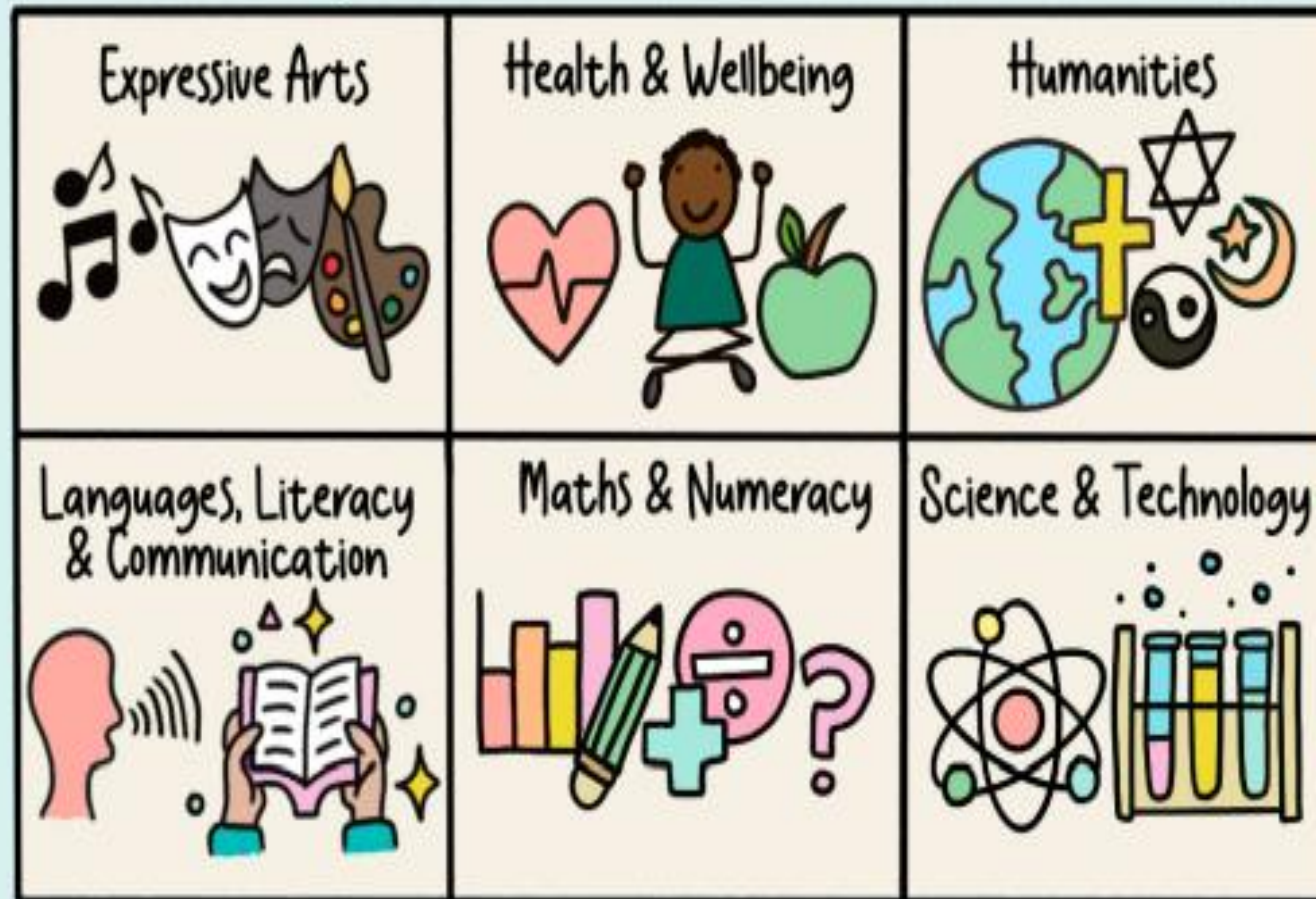


Teach your child to say their name clearly when asked.

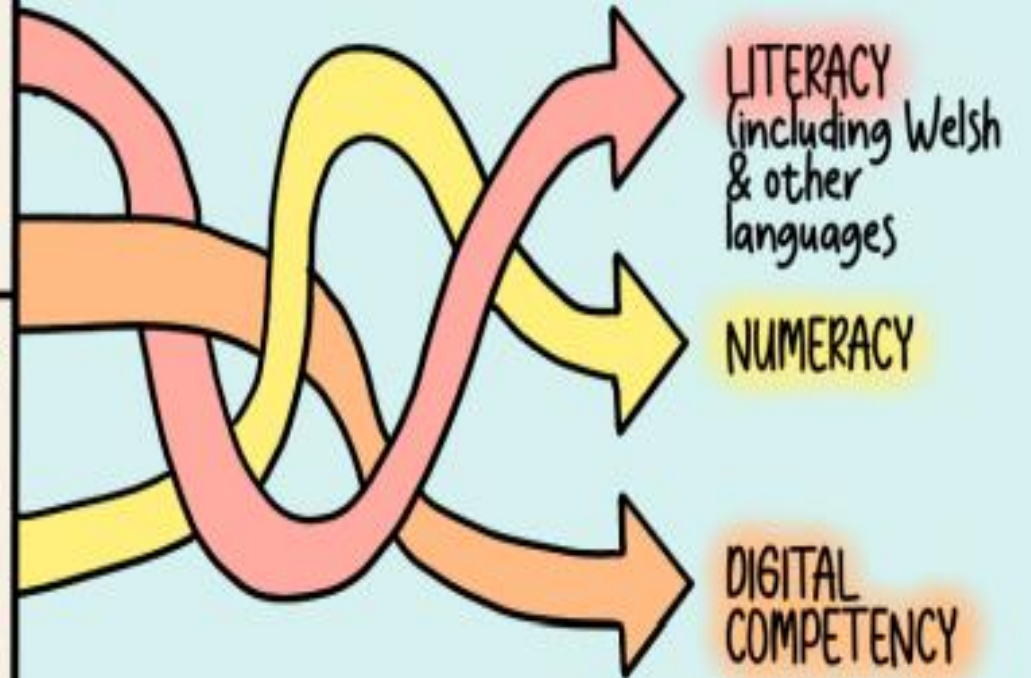

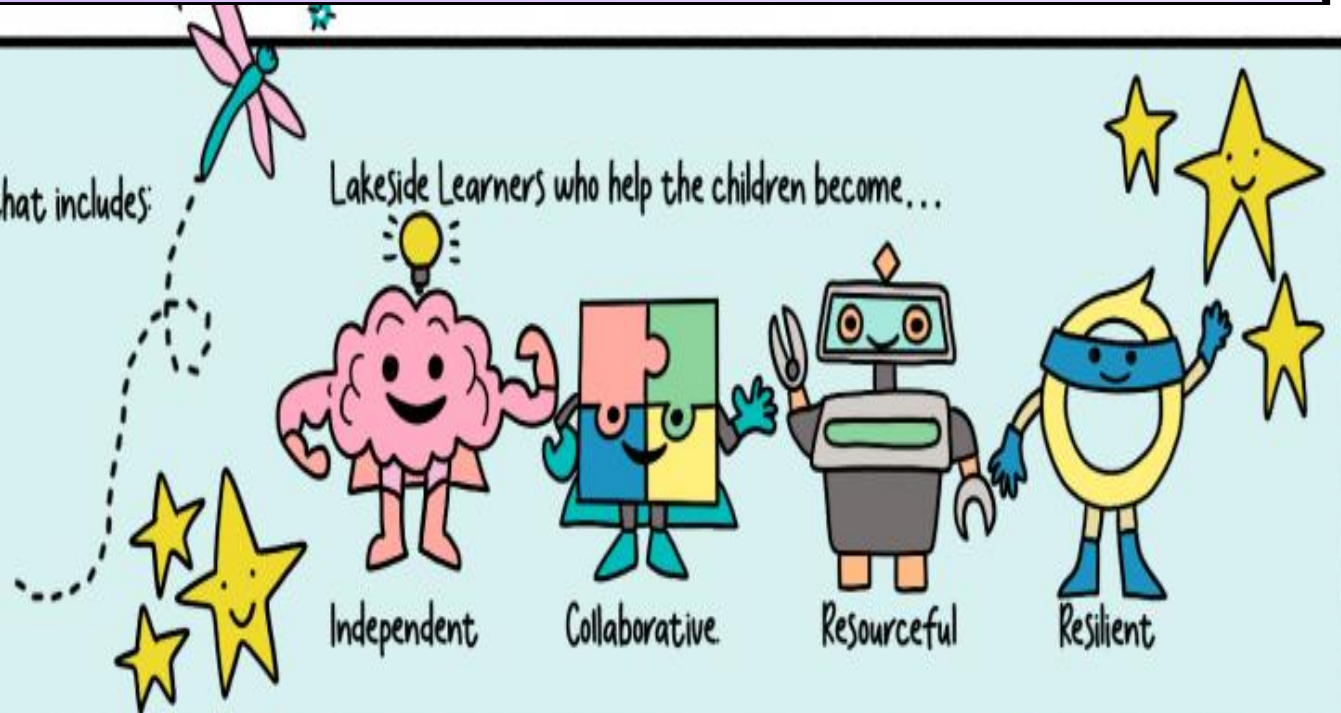

Lakeside Learners who help the children become...



- Every day the children have a focussed activity with the teacher and with the TA
- For the focussed activities, children work in groups – this may be based on ability or mixed ability
- The children also have access to the Enhanced provision, Continuous Provision and the Outdoor Learning area

How can I help my child at school?

- Encourage your child to be independent e.g. when getting dressed, going to the toilet, washing their hands
- Make sure your child is on time to start school - doors open 8.45am, close 8.55am (be aware of cameras and respectful of our school neighbours when parking)
- Be on time to pick up your child - doors open 3.15pm
- If your child is unable to attend school please phone the school office. Medication can only be given to a child in school with a letter from a medical professional
- **Make sure your child's uniform has their name on it**
- **Help your child to complete their homework on Seesaw**
- **Help them to foster an enjoyment of reading by reading to them and with them regularly**
- **Help your child with their reading folder each week and help them with their online bug club reading**
- **Look at numbers and words in the environment around them**
- **Enjoy the outdoors together!**
