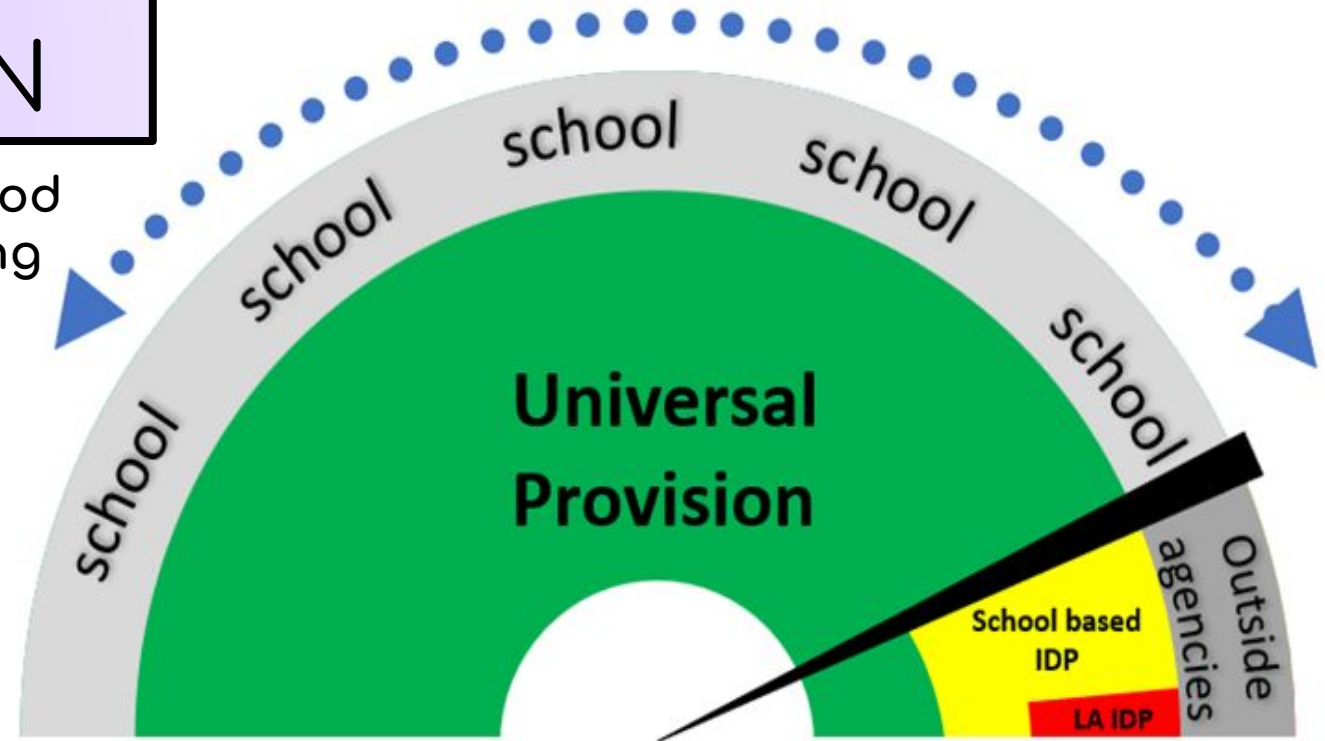


Move from SEN to ALN

Most children and young people will make good progress and will not have Additional Learning Needs (ALN) or require Additional Learning Provision (ALP). The individual needs of these children and young people will be met within universal provision.

Degree of complexity – can move up or down depending on individual pupil needs



'Effective whole school practice and inclusion of all pupils. School delivers high quality routine teaching to meet individual pupil needs.



ALN identified, and school based IDP in place. Advice and support from outside agencies can be sought.




An LA maintained IDP is required, where the school requires additional specialist resources to meet the ALN of the learner.

General information

Communication - any urgent messages must still go via the school office. Seesaw will be used for general communication and reminders.



Book bags will go out on Fridays. Please return on Wednesdays.

Snack / School dinners - Please order ahead of time on  ParentPay and please provide a healthy snack and a freshly filled water bottle every day. (all grapes must be cut in half)

School Uniform - please label everything - including water bottles.

Attendance - arriving to school on time is important to ensure learners know what to expect throughout the day.

How can I help my child at school?

- During week 1 of every half term, Year 2's school webpage will be updated with the numeracy work for that half term. Please see the section on Communication and Helping at home in the Class Pages section.
- Encourage your child to be independent e.g. when getting dressed, making sure their water bottle and snack is in their bag.
- Help them to foster an enjoyment of reading by reading to them and with them regularly.
- Look at numbers and words in the environment around them.
i.e. baking and cooking, shopping lists and birthday wishlists, planning a day out (finding bus and train times, museum opening times, prices of tickets etc)
- Enjoy the outdoors together.
