


# The School Team

# Additional Learning Needs

Most children and young people will make good progress and will not have **Additional Learning Needs** (ALN) or require **Additional Learning Provision** (ALP). The individual needs of these children and young people will be met within **universal provision**.



Degree of complexity – can move up or down depending on individual pupil needs



'Effective whole school practice and inclusion of all pupils. School delivers high quality routine teaching to meet individual pupil needs.



ALN identified, and school based IDP in place. Advice and support from outside agencies can be sought.




An LA maintained IDP is required, where the school requires additional specialist resources to meet the ALN of the learner.
